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The School of Education has various important lines of action, such as teacher education, educational research and the provision of services to the community in general, performing a role model in university leadership in the field. Its activities comprise Undergraduate Program (Pedagogy and Teacher Education), Graduate Program, and Extension Programs, through their respective statutory committees as follows:

The Graduate Committee (GC) has the task of ensuring the implementation of education programs and propose modifications to the curriculum of undergraduate courses offered by FEUSP (Degree in Teaching - Pedagogy) and FEUSP in partnership with other units of the University of São Paulo (other Teaching Degrees).

The Research Committee of the School of Education (CPq) is responsible for coordinating and monitoring programs for Introduction to Scientific Research, (CI) and Pre-Introduction to Scientific Research (pre-IC) with the aim to awaken and stimulate interest in research activity according to different scientific fields of expertise of the School of Education. It is also its responsibility to manage the internships of Graduate students in FEUSP. It also offers support for research through the dissemination of notices from Dean Research and domestic and international Development Agencies. Among the main functions of the Committee of Graduate Program (CPG) is to outline the guidelines and ensure the implementation of the graduate program, as well as, coordinate its didactic and scientific activities.

Commission for Culture and Extension (CCEx) is responsible for deciding on proposals for additional courses and cultural and extention events, guiding faculty in submitting requests for financial aid, in addition to proposing new culture and extension policies and organizing events. According to the principles of FEUSP, the activities promoted by CCEx are mostly directed to meet the demands of the public schools.

These committees act in solidarity with three departments that form FEUSP and develop activities on teaching, research, continuing education and community services in specific fields of knowledge.

The Department of School Administration and Economy of Education (EDA) develops its activities in school administration (finance administration, personnel administration, and organization theories), economy of education, anthropology of educational organizations, special education, educational policy and assessment; it also carries out studies on gender, education and work.

The Department of Philosophy of Education and Educational Sciences (EDF) develops activities in the field of history of education, history of Brazilian education, sociology of education, philosophy of education, psychology of education and special education.

The Department of Teaching Methodology and Comparative Education (EDM) develops activities in teaching methodology, comparative education, didactics, pre-school education, teacher education and special education.
